Animals are living things.

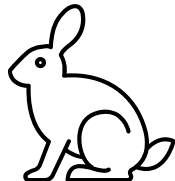
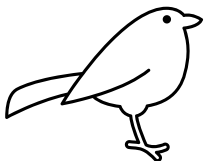
- They need water and find their own food.
