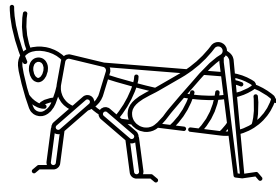
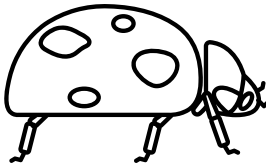

Exploring...

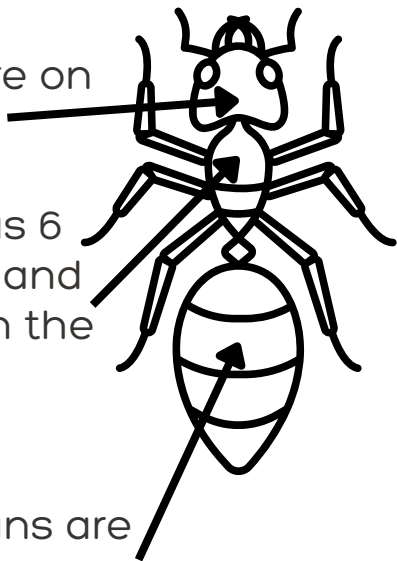
An insect body has 3 parts.

1) **head** 2) **thorax** 3) **abdomen**

The insect's eyes, mouth, and antennae are on the **head**.

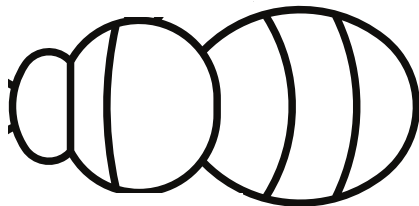
An insect has 6 legs. Its legs and wings are on the **thorax**.

Many of the insect's organs are in its **abdomen**.



What to do

Color the abdomen.



Draw 3 pairs of legs and wings on the thorax.
