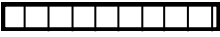
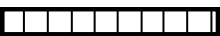

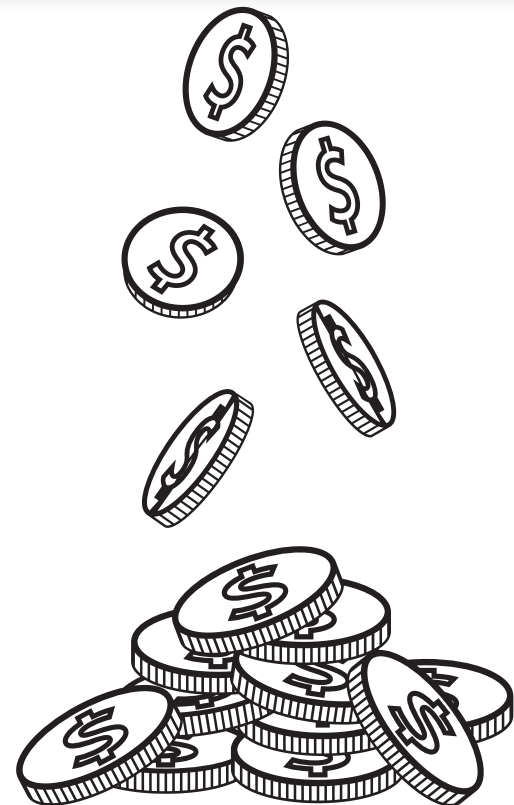

Coin	Color	Size	President
Penny 1 cent	Copper	Small	Beard 
Nickel 5 cents	Silver	Medium	Faces Front or Left 
Dime 10 cents	Silver	Smallest	Faces Left 
Quarter 25 cents	Silver	Largest	Faces Right or Left
