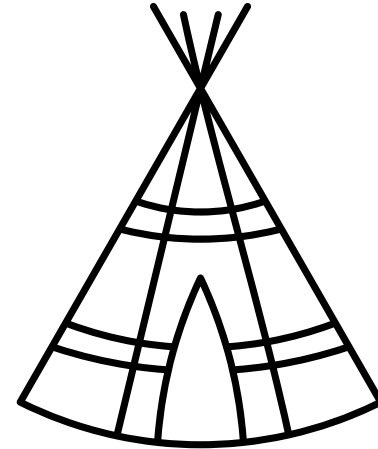

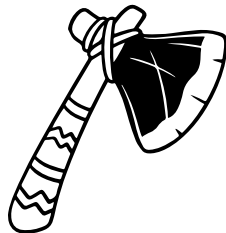
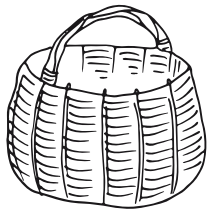


Exploring Natural Resources
