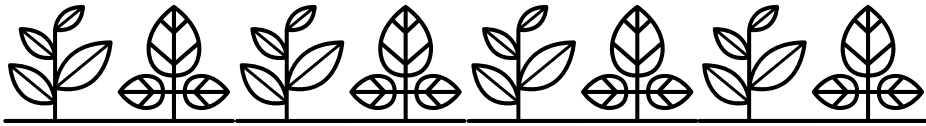

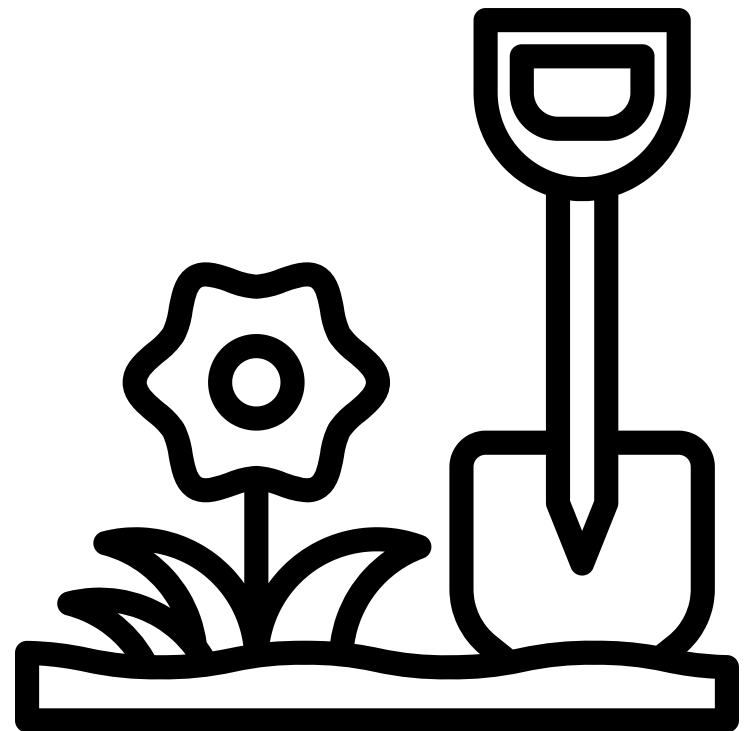

Parts of a plant:

Roots - Hold the plant in the ground. They bring in water.

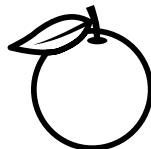
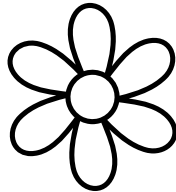
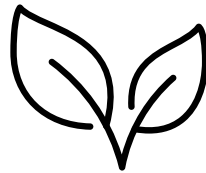
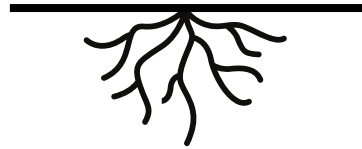
Stems - Hold the plant up above the ground. They bring water to the leaves.

Leaves - Grow from a stem. They collect sunlight to turn into food for the plant.

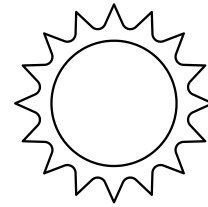
Flowers - Can be colorful. Animals visit flowers for pollen.

Fruits - Holds the seeds.

Seeds - Will become new plants.
