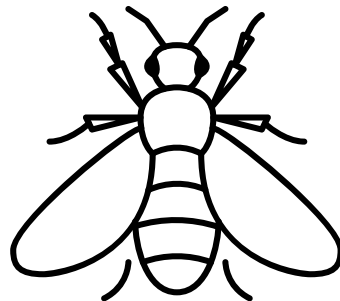
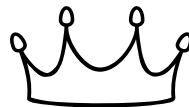

Queen Honey Bees



Exploring...

A group of Honey bees is a colony. A colony lives in a hive.

There are 3 jobs in a hive:
Queen, worker, and drone.

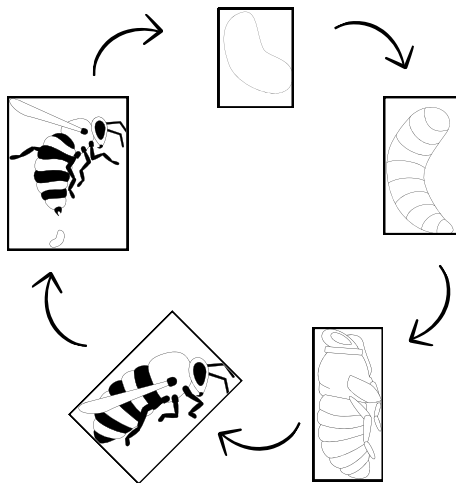
There is only 1 **queen** in the hive. She lays eggs that will become new bees. She can lay 2,500 eggs a day!



The queen can live for 5 years. When the queen dies, worker bees feed "royal jelly" to a young bee, larva, to turn it into the queen.
