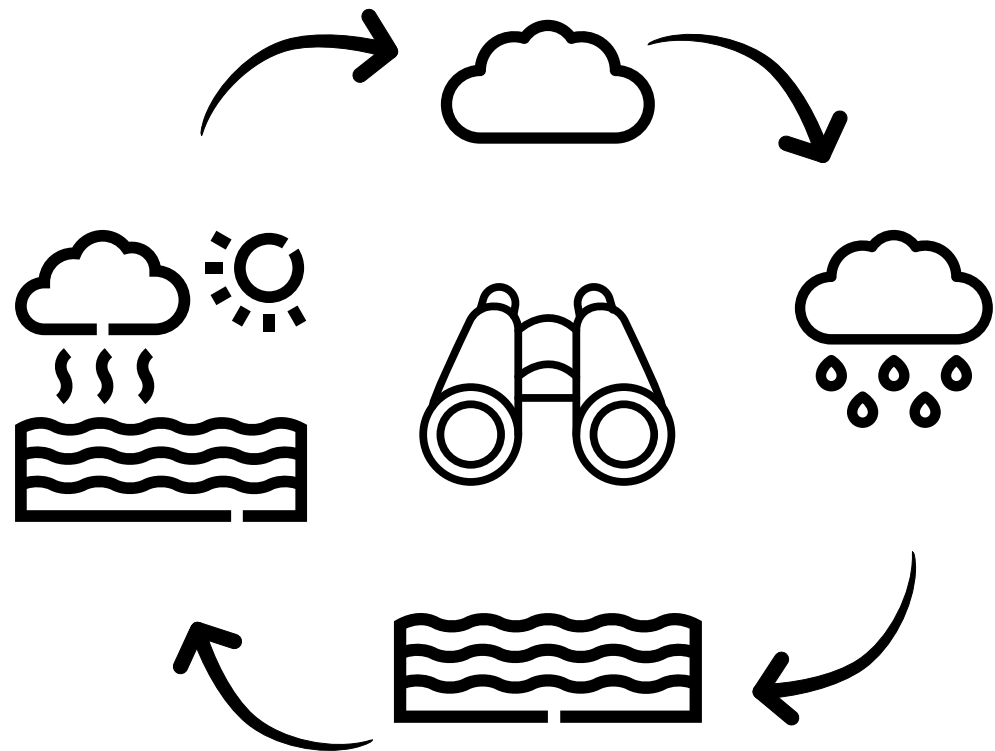

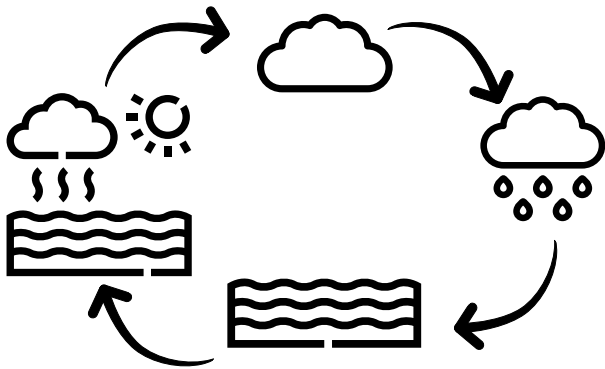

Exploring...

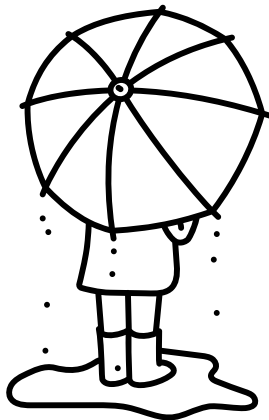
Water moves in a pattern.

puddles.

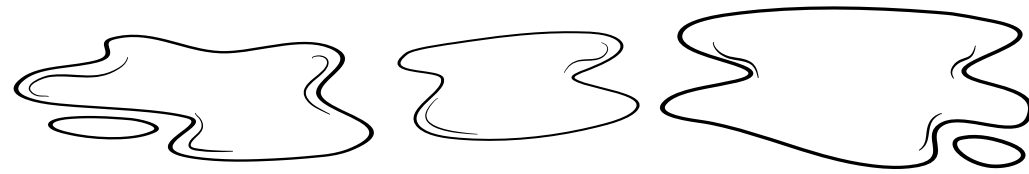
It adds to lakes, rivers,
