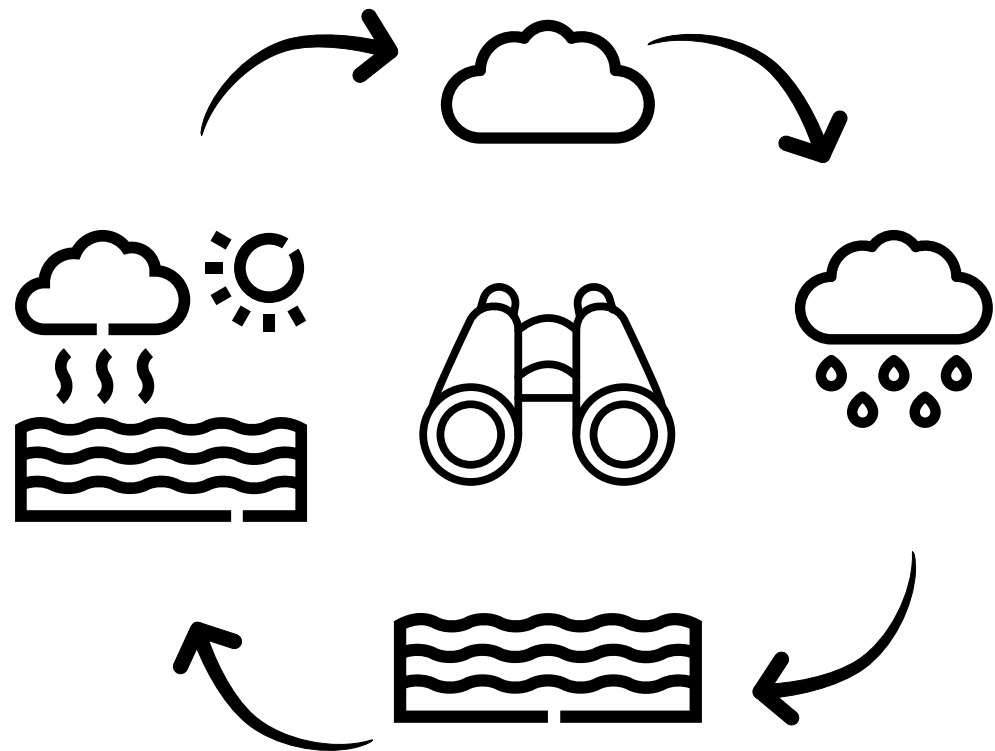

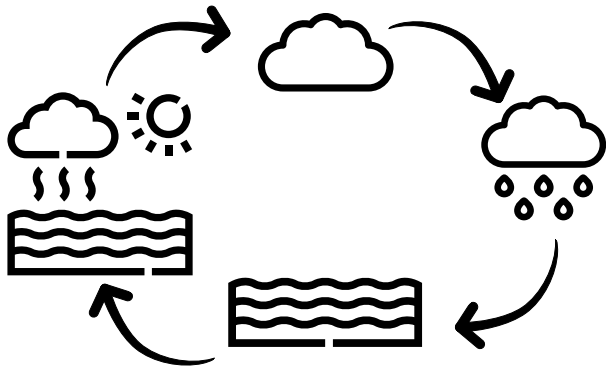

Water Cycle Watchers: Precipitation

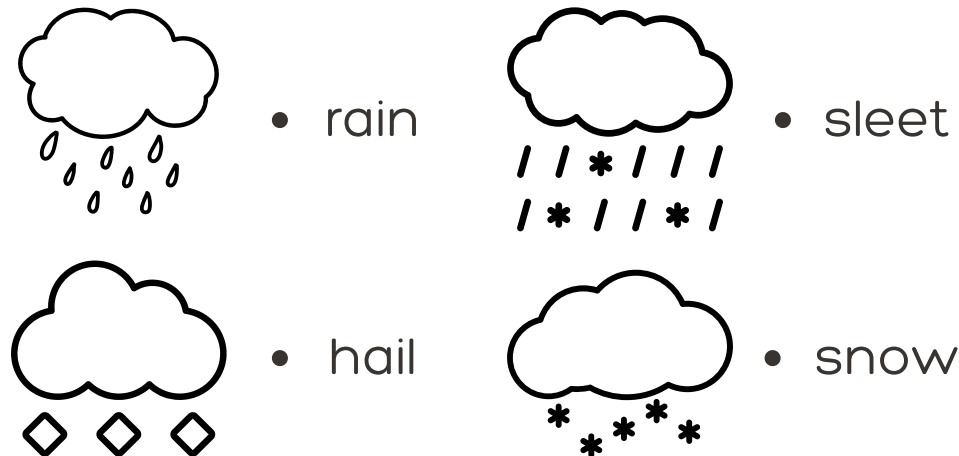


Exploring...

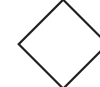

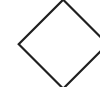
