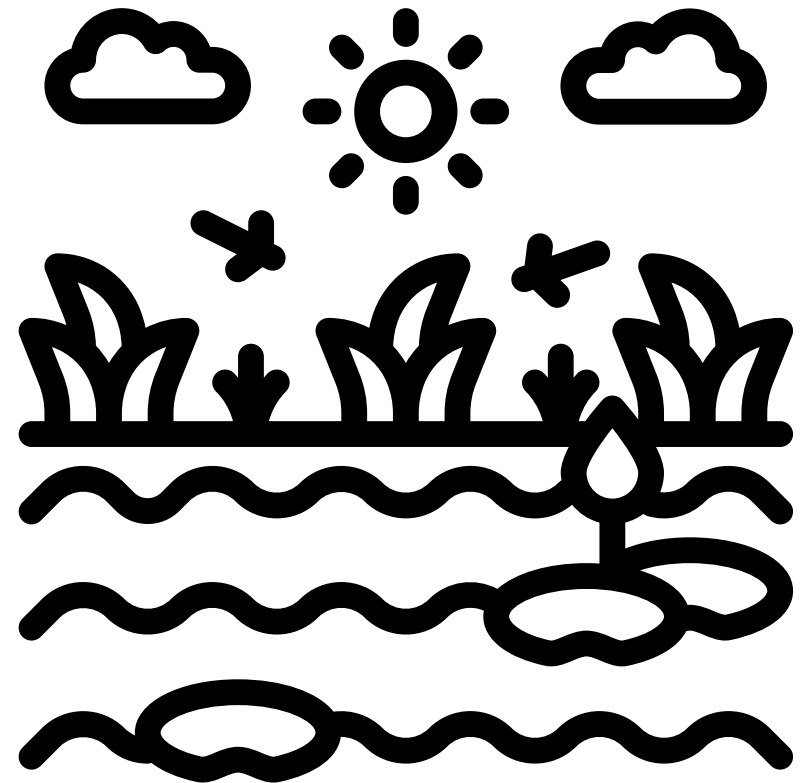

Wetland Animals



Exploring...

Wetlands have land that is covered by water. They can be swamps, marshes, or bogs.

Some animals can live in the wet soil. Wetland animals might:

- have webbed feet
- have brown or green fur, feathers, or skin
- be able to swim

1. Cut out the animals.
2. With a partner ask: Can this animal live in the wetlands?
3. If you say "yes", put them in the "wetlands" box. If "no", put them in the "not the wetlands" box.
4. Flip over the cards to see if you are right!
